Chairperson Decker called the meeting to order.

RECOGNIZE GUESTS AND PUBLIC COMMENT:

Fred Foster and Andy Socie, Huntingdon Area School District, were present to speak to the Committee regarding some consideration for the possibility of painting some lines to establish parking spaces for the students. The School District would provide the materials and the paint. We would not do anything in front of anyone's house that they are not agreeing to. We are looking at the area of Cassidy Avenue between 24th and 25th. Mr. Foster will send a revised letter to Manager Wheeler. Council saw no problem with permitting the School Districts request.

Councilperson Isenberg asked if the track was going to be completed by spring. Mr. Foster responded that they are scheduled to be complete the 3rd week in September.

JUNIATA COLLEGE-CAMPUS STORMWATER PLAN

MEETING: Manager Wheeler reported that it is going well.

JUNIATA COLLEGE-WINTON HILL PROJECT: Manager Wheeler stated the Winton Hill Project is back on schedule and plan to have it opened by mid-October.

JUNIATA COLLEGE-COLD SPRINGS ROAD/ MOORE STREET

PROJECT: Manager Wheeler reported the project is back on. They have asked for the Borough to give them a green light for part 2. They have finished their preliminary design. We have signed off on the utility portion.

BOROUGH ACTIVITIES REGISTRATION: Manager Wheeler reported that this is in progress.

NEW BUSINESS: Chairperson Decker asked what the procedure is for the next step to get the Yard Sale Ordinance approved. It was passed at a regular meeting; however, Mayor Brown vetoed it. Manager Wheeler will check into it.

Councilperson Isenberg informed Council that Dubois Business College is closing on Sept. 22nd. She asked who would be obligated for the insurance for the gymnasium. Councilperson Gradwell would like to push to get bike paths in the Borough He thinks this is something that Council should look into.

Councilperson Gradwell asked about periodical lighting on Penn Street at the Diamond. He would like this to be looked into.

Councilperson Gradwell stated we only have one banner for Christmas. He would like to have a banner put on Penn .Street. Councilperson Bair explained that the power at that area is not turned on.
