Acting Chairperson Enyeart called the meeting to order.

RECOGNIZE GUESTS AND PUBLIC COMMENT: Gary Cramer asked what the Borough is doing about 10th and Moore Street. Councilperson Isenberg responded that we are planning to discuss that in Public Safety Committee.

Dean Harris asked if he was permitted to ask about leaks in the Borough. Mr. Harris commented that if you were serious about leak detection you would have men out every day replacing old lines. He stated that it was brought up about changing meters. That is a waste of time. Council needs to start replacing water lines.

Patti Bucynski asked if Council had an update on what is going on at 1417 Scott Street. Manager Wheeler stated that he has not be able to get in touch with anyone at the Conservation District. The contractor came in to the office and received the necessary permits and then went to Bureau Veritas. Manager Wheeler stated that they are not doing anything that they are not permitted to do. Ms. Bucynski responded that she is glad they received permits.

MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Chairperson Enyeart asked if there were any questions on the Maintenance Supervisor's Report.

Councilperson Gradwell asked Supt. Yarnell would does attribute that the water meters were read in only 7 days this time. Supt Yarnell responded it's the right person doing the job.

CEMETERY: Manager Wheeler reported that he will be advertising for bids for the paving at the Cemetery.

SUMMER SEASONAL WORKERS FOR MAINTENANCE: Manager Wheeler reported that he is still short one person for the summer mowing crew.

BOROUGH CLEAN-UP: Manager Wheeler reported that the total cost for clean-up was around \$7,900.00. It will email Council the exact figure.

NEW BUSINESS:

YARD WASTE OPENING: The Committee decided that the yard waste facility will be opening on Wednesdays in addition to Saturdays beginning Wednesday, May 25th from 3:00 pm-7:00 pm.

POTHOLE & SHOULDER REPAIRS: Supt. Yarnell reported that he is working on potholes and shoulder repairs as weather permits. Councilperson Isenberg reported that there is a large pot hole in the road when coming out of the school driveway by Mr. Geissinger's property.
