

**PARKS, RECREATION & PUBLIC PROPERTY COMMITTEE MEETING**  
**AUGUST 3, 2017**  
**5:00 pm**

The following persons were present for the meeting: Committee member Jim Bair; President David Quarry, Councilmembers Donna Isenberg, David Fortson, James Decker, Sr., and Borough Manager William W. Wheeler.

Acting Chairperson Bair called the meeting to order.

**VISITORS:** Ed Tos and Ryan Gibboney from Re-envision Huntingdon.

**RECOGNIZE GUESTS AND PUBLIC COMMENT:** Ryan Gibboney stated that she has received some small grant project ideas that would be on Borough property. She also wanted to confirm that the Senior Project of the Mural at the Weis Market was no longer happening. She spoke with Madison Troha, Junior Council Person, and was told that Madison is not pursuing this. The Re-envision Huntingdon Board met with their donors. They agree on “inviting creative play and reading” at Weaver Park.

**MAYOR’S REPORT:** Mayor Brown is not present.

**PARKS COMMISSION REPORT:** Ed Tos gave an update on the Park Commission. Mr. Tos reminded that the Park Commission would move forward with the Dog Park. The Commission met at Laney Park to consider the placement of the Dog Park. They looked at both sides of Ice Plant Road. They looked at the side of the road next to Laney’s. Manager Wheeler stated that area is designated for the Borough’s permitted bulk water distribution. This will be put on the agenda for the Regular Council meeting to approve the Commission to move forward with this project.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

**WEAVER PARK MURAL:** This was already discussed. The project will be moving forward with Ryan.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

**SMALL PROJECTS BIG IDEAS GRANT-WEAVER PARK:** This was already discussed.

**RIVERVIEW CEMETARY-** Councilperson Bair stated that it has been discussed to do something to enhance the entrance to the cemetery. He would like to see the Committee move forward with this. Manager Wheeler will speak with Councilperson Houck.

**BLAIRFIELD:** Councilperson Decker feels we have very few people that are residents that participate in the City League. He feels that they are not maintaining Blairfield when they are using it. Manager Wheeler suggested that an agreement is drawn up stating what the Borough's expectations are when using the field. Councilperson Bair will send a message to Councilperson Houck.
