

Stage II – Mandatory Water Conservation

- A. Trigger Point – These actions will occur when the flow in Standing Stone Creek has dropped to 8.0 mgd or 1.5 inches (continuously for a 4 week period) above the sharp crested weir on the dam spillway.
- B. The goal of mandatory restrictions is to achieve a 10 to 20% reduction in water usage.
- C. Mandatory Demand Restrictions – In addition to voluntary compliance to the Stage 1 conservation measures listed in Section V, all customers (residential & nonresidential) shall eliminate the following unnecessary uses of water:
 - 1. All outside use of water for watering lawns and gardens
 - 2. Washing of cars, trucks and other vehicles
 - 3. The washing of sidewalks, porches or other flat surfaces
 - 4. The topping-off or filling of swimming pools
- D. Mandatory Supply & Demand Restrictions will be publicized to all customers of the Borough's Water System via the local media.
- E. All non-essential water customers will be limited to the greatest extent possible.
- F. Commercial car washes and volunteer fire companies are permitted to use water at a reasonable rate that is consistent with the conservation efforts of this Plan.
- G. Fines for violation of mandatory water restrictions shall be as provided for in the municipal resolutions in the service area.
